



**3. Eggshell Geodes****Materials:**

- Water
- Jars or cups
- Alum
- Eggshell
- Food coloring
- White glue

**Method:**

- Heat 2 2/3 cups of water and add 1/2 tsp food coloring and 1 1/3 cup of alum powder.
- Stir until dissolved, and then carefully transfer the solution to two heat proof jars. Hotter water makes larger the crystals. Cooler water makes smaller sized crystals.
- Optional:** Seed the inside of the eggshell with glue and sprinkle alum powder over surface.
- Place eggshell in alum solution and let sit for 12-24 hours.

When water freezes, it forms a crystal. But water's not the only thing that can make crystals. Most minerals and salts can form crystals, especially if they are in a solution with water and the water evaporates.

TABLE SALT MAKES CRYSTALS THAT LOOK LIKE BLOCKS.

ALUM AND EPSOM CRYSTALS LOOK LIKE THIS!

- HALOCLINE: layers of water having different amounts of salt.
- Method:
- Prepare salt water and plain water. Make sure the salt water and plain water don't pour directly into the salt water—pour the water onto a spoon held by the side of the cup just above the salt water—then pour the water into the salt water.
  - Fill 3 jars or cups. One with plain water, one with salt water, and one with salt water layered on top.
  - Fill jars or cups. One with plain water, and one by carefully filling it half way with water, then salt water, and then plain water.
  - Place the eggs in the jars and layering the top water on top.
  - Observe if they sink or float.

- Materials:
- Tap water
  - Jars or cups
  - Salt water
  - Eggs

BEAUTIFUL!**4. Borax Snowflakes****Materials:**


- Water
- Pipe cleaner
- String
- Borax powder
- Jars or cups
- Food coloring
- Pencil or piece of cardboard

**Method:**

- Heat 4 cups of water and add 1 cup Borax. Stir well.
- Take three pipe cleaners and fold into a snowflake shape.
- Suspend the snowflake in the borax solution using the string and cardboard or pencil.
- Wait 12 to 24 hours and then remove from solution. To preserve the crystal, coat it with clear nail polish.

- Method:
- Mix the dry ingredients together in a bowl.
  - Mix the wet ingredients together in a fork or whisk.
  - Pack the mixture into clear molds and cover the mold.
  - Carefully remove egg or ball and let sit 24 to 48 hours.
- Materials:
- 1/4 C baking soda
  - 1 Tbsp cornstarch
  - 1/4 C citric acid
  - Water
  - 1/4 C epsom salt
  - Plastic oil
  - 1/4 C olive oil
  - 1/4 C vegetable oil
  - 1/4 C water


